Valley Residential Services is a non-profit agency providing support services for members of our community since 1982.

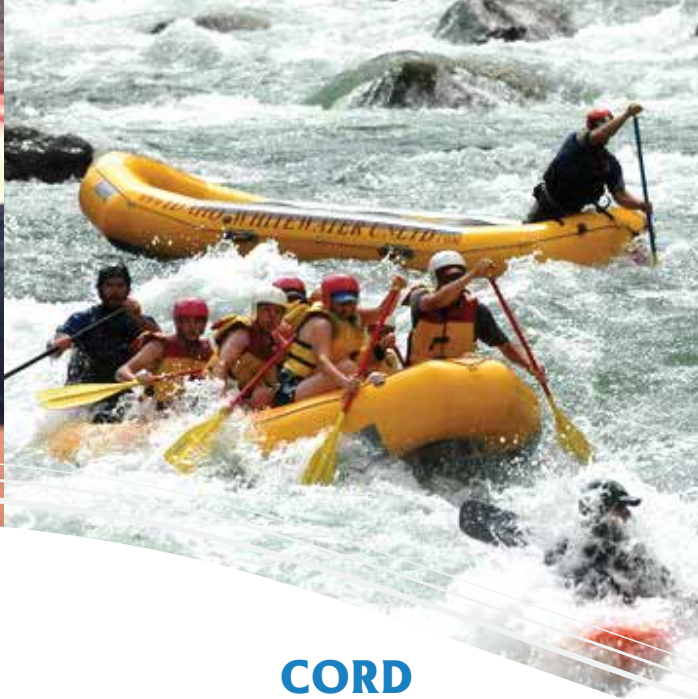

Our mission and goal is to empower people with developmental disabilities to lead more fulfilling and independent lives. Our areas of service to adults with developmental disabilities include:

Health and Safety: We ensure the health, safety, and well-being of our clients. We help with medication supervision, medical appointments, nutrition, and other health & safety areas.

Positive Recognition: We help build the self confidence and esteem of our clients by recognizing the positive achievements in their lives, and assisting them to meet their goals and dreams.

Power & Choice: We help every person have the freedom and ability to make personal choices and decisions affecting their own lives.

Community Integration: We ensure that our clients are active in our community, and are integrated, valuable members of this community.

Positive Relationships: We nurture and encourage strong family, friend, and community relationships for all of our clients.

Competence and Self Reliance: Our goal is to assist our clients to learn the skills that will enable them to live without assistance from others, empowered by their own independence!

CORD is a transitional housing program for homeless veterans. The CORD program is designed to break the cycle of homelessness among veterans by utilization of a seamless continuum of health care treatment services. This program provides veterans with an opportunity to change their homeless lifestyle through the development of skills, personal growth, recovery, self-reliance, productivity, residential stability, and community involvement.

Opening in 1997, the program is the culmination of a cooperative effort between the Walla Walla Veterans Administration Medical Center, the Walla Walla Housing Authority, and Valley Residential Services.

Valley Residential Services provides supervised visitation, transportation, and parenting skills instruction for parents who receive services from the DSHS Division of Children and Family Services (DCFS). All clients must be referred through DCFS.
